“The Gospel is the Power of God for Salvation”

¹ Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, ² which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, ³ concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh ⁴ and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, ⁵ through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, ⁶ including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ...

¹⁶ For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. ¹⁷ For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, “The righteous shall live by faith.” (Rom 1:1–6, 16-17 ESV)

The gospel is our focus for 2017. To be sure, the good news of Christ deserves to be at the center of our lives every year, at every moment. But I believe that we need to grow in our understanding of the truth of the gospel, and to experience God's saving power more fully. So many Bible passages, books, prayers and conversations have been pointing to the importance of the gospel.

The gospel is God's gracious announcement to us. Our Savior had died for our sins, and in risen to give life everlasting to all who trust in him.

The gospel is God's power to save us. It can renew our minds, encourage our fearful hearts, and enable us to live by faith.

The gospel is a great treasure, but we can take it for granted and let it be far from our minds. We know we came to be Christians by believing in the gospel of Jesus. That work is not done. God continues to work in us through the gospel, and we need to continue to remind ourselves of the gospel. We need to pray it and preach it to ourselves daily. That is my big prayer for us as a congregation this year. May God touch us daily with the power of the gospel so that we might live by faith.

This is the key verse: “For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes.” We will take time to pray for this, and to learn about this gospel power as we hear and respond to God's word. That is my aim for the whole year. We can begin now by keeping this verse before us. May God fill our minds and hearts and worship and conversations and service with the saving power of the gospel.
